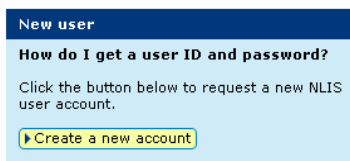


The NLIS Database is a central database that can be accessed over the internet. Any producer with a Property Identification Code (PIC) can set-up an NLIS Database account. Having access to the NLIS Database will enable you to record animal movements, obtain lists of your cattle and access carcase feedback information.



## How do I create an account?

Step	Action
1	Go to the NLIS database website <a href="http://www.nlis.mla.com.au">www.nlis.mla.com.au</a>
2	Click on the <b>Create a new account</b> button.
