Community Awareness Survey

The Anti-Discrimination Commission (ADC) today launched an online Community Awareness Survey designed to raise public awareness of discrimination and equal opportunity issues and promote the work of the ADC.

Anti-Discrimination Commissioner, Tony Fitzgerald, said that the results of the survey will assist the ADC to further develop its public education strategies to promote understanding and acceptance of the principles of equal opportunity and non-discrimination.

"The ADC works to build community harmony through raising awareness of discrimination, equal opportunity and human rights. The ADC also accepts complaints and conciliates discrimination and sexual harassment disputes within our community" said Commissioner Fitzgerald.

Commissioner Fitzgerald urges Territorians to complete the survey so that the ADC, as the leading human rights agency in the Territory, can better understand community views of discrimination issues, in order to best meet the needs of NT residents.
