

No matter where you live in the Territory, you can play your part in crime prevention and reduction by reporting suspicious activities and crime.

Don't hesitate because you think your tip-off might be trivial – it might be the missing link that completes a picture for investigators in relation to a crime.

You might know the identity of a hit-and-run driver or someone whose face looks like that on a police identikit. Perhaps you've overheard a pub chat between drug dealers, or spotted a suspicious boat unloading cargo off the coast.

All such observations should be reported to police through the police assistance **131 444** number or the Territory-wide Crime Stoppers toll free line, **1800 333 000**.

The **131 444** number is the new number for police assistance if it is not an emergency situation. The number will put the caller through to their nearest police station.

Crime Stoppers allows calls to be made anonymously. In some instances a reward of up to **\$1000** may also be offered for information that leads to an arrest.

The scheme is a partnership between the police, a community-based management board, the many sponsors who donate reward money and other services, media outlets that publicise weekly target crimes and, of course, you, the ordinary citizen who could hold the key to solving a crime.
