CHANGES TO LIQUOR LICENCE APPLICATION

BORROLOOLA HOTEL MOTEL

This notice is to advise the public that changes have been made by the applicant to their liquor licence application for the Borroloola Hotel.

The Changes include:

- **No Takeaway:** The application for a takeaway liquor licence is withdrawn*.
- **Restricted Heavy Beer Sales:** The type of liquor that may be sold from the Lounge Bar is changed to prohibit the sale of VB (Heavy) and XXXX (Heavy) but to allow the sale of 'Boutique' beer.
- **Amended Hours of Trade:** The hours of trade for selling liquor "on premises" at the Hotel have been reduced as follows:

A more detailed copy of the applicant's amended application including their proposed Management Plan for Responsible Drinking is available at the Borroloola Hotel or through the Director of Licensing.

NOTE: All written objections that have already been received and accepted by the Commission will be taken into account at the hearing so far as they relate to the amended application.

Any further written objections regarding the amended application shall be accepted by the Commission if they are received before Friday 29 June 2007.

Pursuant to Section 47F(2) of the *Liquor Act* an objection may only be made on the ground that the grant of the licence may or will adversely affect:

- (a) the amenity of the neighbourhood where the premises the subject of the application are or will be located; or
- (b) health, education, public safety or social conditions in the community.

Only those persons, organisations or groups described in Section 47F(3) of the *Liquor Act* may make an objection. Section 47G of the *Liquor Act* requires the Director of Licensing to inform the applicant of the substance of any objection. This will include the identity and where relevant the address of the objector.
