Greyhound Attendant's Registration Certificate

What Does This Certificate Allow Me To Do?

You can handle greyhounds during race meetings at greyhound tracks in the Northern Territory.

Are There Any Special Conditions Or Restrictions?

You must agree to comply with all rules and regulations applying to greyhound racing in the Northern Territory. This includes willingness to comply with any conditions imposed by greyhound club officials and stewards for the conduct of race meetings.

You must be at least 16 years of age unless handling dogs owned by your parents/legal guardians, in which case you must be at least 14 years of age.

What Is The Application Process?

Territory Business Centres provide application forms. Completed forms must be accompanied by the prescribed fee*.

Information requested on the application form includes:

- details of any previous disqualifications or other disciplinary actions involving racing authorities
- details of any previous offence punishable by fine or imprisonment.
- After you have submitted the completed application form, accompanied by the fee*, allow five working days for processing.

Do I Need Any Special Knowledge, Experience Or Training?

There are no formal training requirements. However, you must be able to demonstrate knowledge of correct greyhound handling procedures. These include procedures for the kennelling of greyhounds at race meetings or trials, and the parade to and placing of greyhounds in the starting boxes.

How Long Is The Certificate Valid And What Is The Process For Renewal?

The certificate is valid for up to two years with an annual expiry date of 28 February. To renew your certificate, complete a renewal form and pay the fee.

Is The Certificate Recognised Interstate?

Arrangements exist for mutual recognition of greyhound ownership in other states and territories.
