INFORMATION FOR OBJECTORS

Where a notice of valuation is given to a person or rating authority, that person may, within 30 days, lodge an objection with the Valuer-General. The Valuer-General shall consider the matter and shall provide notice in writing of his decision.

A person dissatisfied with the decision of the Valuer-General may lodge an objection with the Chairman of the Valuation Board of Review Panel. An objection must be lodged within 30 days and must be accompanied by the prescribed fee, currently \$20.00.

The letter of objection should be accompanied by copies of:-

- a written submission detailing your objection and evidence in support of the objection;
- the Notice of Valuation (from the Valuer-General);
- the Objection to Valuation (sent to the Valuer-General under section 18 of the Act);
- the Notice of Decision of Valuer-General on Objection.

In the case of large volume submissions five copies (original +4) of all documentation should be submitted to the Board. An electronic copy if available would also be helpful.

Cheques should be made payable to the Receiver of Territory Monies (RTM).

The Chairman selects 3 panel members to form a board to consider the objection. Arrangements are made by the Registrar for the hearing to take place. You may represent yourself, or you may choose to be represented by a legal practitioner, a valuer, or a member of the Real Estate Institute of Australia, as noted in section 20J of the Act. It is usual for a representative of the Valuer-General to be present at the hearing.

It is up to you to put any information or documentation in support of your objection to valuation to the Board for consideration. Members may choose to undertake a site visit as part of the hearing.

The Board may disallow or allow the objection, wholly or in part. You will be advised in writing of the outcome.
