Artist in Schools Program closing soon

Closing 1 May

The aim of the Artists in Schools (AiS) program is to provide students, teachers, parents and the wider community with first-hand opportunities to work with professional artists over a period of time, and experience the creative processes, skills, attitudes and disciplines the artist brings to their work. This program enriches school arts programs and encourages future artists and arts audiences in all art forms. The NT Department of Education and Training (DET), the Department of Natural Resources, Environment, the Arts and Sport (NRETAS) and the Australia Council for the Arts jointly fund the AiS program through small grants to schools that enable the employment of a professional artist or artists to work with the school community. Artists in Schools grants are available to schools and group schools and for 2009 will increase for the first time in more than ten years. The maximum grant

A Passion for Indigenous Art

The Acting Director of Museum and Art Gallery Northern Territory (MAGNT), Apolline Kohen has curated a major exhibition set to open today at the Drill Hall Gallery, Canberra featuring works by internationally known Indigenous artist John Mawurndjul. Playing Australia: 16 arts companies to tour the country

Arts Minister Peter Garrett announced \$3.153 million in Playing Australia funding for 16 arts companies to tour live performances across the country. "This funding will ensure audiences in regional communities have access to performances by some of Australia's best performing arts companies," Mr Garrett said. "Successful Round 33 applicants cover a range of art forms including comedy, children's theatre, Indigenous music and circus." The Northern Territory will see performances such as *Circus Oz* the Co-Operas *La Boheme* and *I Don't Wanna Play House* by Yirra Yaakin in 2009. www.environment.gov.au

Regional Arts receive culture funding boost

Arts Minister Peter Garrett today announced \$1.2 million in funding for 16 national strategic cultural development projects across regional Australia. Through the national strategic component of the Regional Arts Fund program, Regional Arts Australia will administer these 16 projects as part of a four-year framework developed in collaboration with the Regional Arts Organisations across Australia. Arts NT within the Department of Natural Resources, Environment, the Arts and Sport receives \$44,000 for *the No Boundaries* project to improve the accessibility for emerging artists and organisations in remote Northern Territory. www.environment.gov.au

Arts in Australia's national school curriculum

Australian children are guaranteed an arts-rich education following agreement by federal, state and territory education ministers that arts be included in the national curriculum. Arts Minister Peter Garrett said he was thrilled that arts subjects – including the visual and performing arts – would sit beside English, maths, history, sciences, geography and languages in the national curriculum. "Creativity, interpretation, innovation and cultural understanding are all sought-after skills for new and emerging industries in the 21st century. Arts education provides students with the tools to develop these skills," Mr Garrett said. www.environment.gov.au
