

DISCOVER THE MAN WHO DISCOVERED SUPERCROC

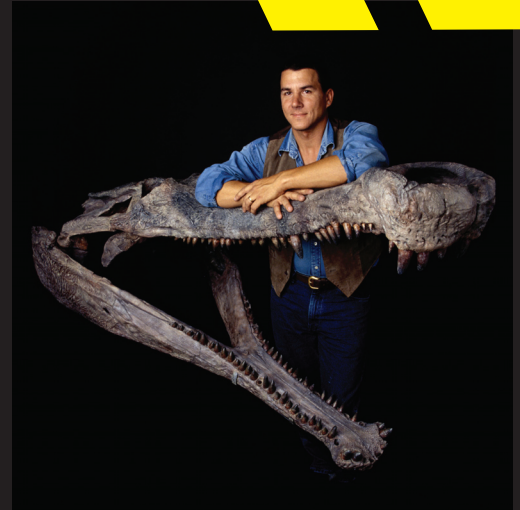
World famous palaeontologist in Darwin

Meet Dr Paul Sereno, a modern-day Indiana Jones and discoverer of more than two dozen new dinosaurs on five continents.

Internationally renowned for discovering an almost complete skeleton of the extinct 12-metre-long dinosaur-eating 'Supercroc', *Sarcosuchus imperator*, Dr Sereno, a Professor at the University of Chicago, is a National Geographic 'explorer in residence', earning the *Chicago Tribune's* Teacher of the Year Award (1996) and the Boston Museum of Science's Walker Prize for extraordinary contributions in palaeontology (1997).

Complementing the Museum and Art Gallery Northern Territory's exhibition *Supercrocodilians: Darwin's ultimate survival story*, which features a 'Supercroc' replica skull, Dr Sereno and the Territory's own 'Mr Crocodile', Dr Adam Britton, will present the following talks on extinct and modern crocodilians.
