Darwin Harbour Advisory Committee chair John Bailey has described the recent two-week series of seminars about the Darwin Harbour region as a success.

“We regularly had more than 25 people attending the evening seminars at the Museum and Art Gallery of the NT with more than 50 people attending on some of the nights,” Mr Bailey said.
