### **Walker Creek and Bamboo Creek Closed**

The Northern Territory Parks and Wildlife Service advises that Walker Creek and Bamboo Creek at Litchfield National Park are closed for the remainder of the wet season due to flooding.

Chief District Ranger John McCartney said the closure was routine for this time of year and follows the recent closures at other popular attractions within Litchfield National Park.

These closures include the Table Top walking track, Reynolds 4WD track, Florence Falls 4WD campgrounds, Butterfly Gorge, the Lost City, the Sandy Creek Falls 4WD track and the Surprise Creek Falls 4WD track.

“Track and facility closures are routine during this time of year and these decisions are made in the interests of public safety,” Mr McCartney said.

Litchfield National Park, situated 100km south-west of Darwin, is home to some of the Territory’s most spectacular waterfalls, with camp grounds, walking tracks and 4WD tracks also very popular among visitors. The popular Florence Falls and Buley Rockhole remain open.
