Mother's Day at Territory Wildlife Park

One of the Territory's top country music bands will perform for free at the Territory Wildlife Park this Sunday as part of the popular attraction's Mother's Day celebrations.

Park manager Stuart Traynor said five piece band *Whisky Creek* would perform an intimate and relaxed concert to entertain the whole family from 2.30pm to 5.30pm.

"The concert is expected to last a few hours so families are certainly encouraged to bring their chairs and rugs to enjoy the music on the Park's picnic lawns," Mr Traynor said.

"These five long term local musicians bring a diverse range of musical styles together and present them in a contemporary country format.

"Featuring the vocal talents of Road to Tamworth finalist Jackie Izod, *Whisky Creek* play a range of original songs and contemporary covers that perfectly match the Top End lifestyle."

Mr Traynor said that while eskies are not permitted there will be food and drinks for sale during the concert.

He said normal entry fees apply and Territorians who have not already received a Territorian Pass should ask how to obtain one on the day.

"The Territorian Pass has been extremely successful since its inception last year," Mr Traynor said.

"People already with a Territorian Pass can come to the Park as many times as they like for free within a 12 month period, which is especially handy and economical for families, who might like to visit the Park more than once a year.

"This year's Mother's Day is set to be great with plenty of attractions available for the entire family."

Mr Traynor said Territorian Passes will be available to all Northern Territory residents at the Territory Wildlife Park upon presentation of appropriate identification.
