Eggs Abound at Territory Wildlife Park

The Easter long weekend will be filled with egg-citement for families heading to the Territory Wildlife Park from 21-24 March 2008.

Territory Wildlife Park Marketing Officer Tegan Christophersen said the Park has a great line-up of activities planned with a special Easter theme.

“The Wildlife Park houses many of the Top End’s lesser known egg-layers such as echidnas, monitors and frilled-neck lizards,” Ms Christophersen said.

“We’ve hidden their footprints amongst different habitats around the park, corresponding to the area where the animal lives.

“Kids can join the “egg hunt” and if they find all the hidden tracks they receive eggs - of the chocolate kind - as their prize.”

Ms Christophersen said the Park’s Main Station will feature a special “egg display” to showcase the different varieties of eggs produced by the local inhabitants.

“The eggs all range in size from the larger emu eggs to quite small eggs such as the frilled-neck lizard.

“Another popular activity will be the animal face painting with artists on hand to transform kids into native animals such as crocodiles, butterflies and dingoes.

The Territory Wildlife Park will be open everyday over the Easter long weekend from 8.30am til 6pm.
