## **Reynolds 4WD Track Open**

The Department of Natural Resources, Environment and The Arts advises that the northern section of the Reynolds 4WD track at Litchfield National Park will be re-opened this Saturday 17 May 2008.

Litchfield Senior Park Ranger Luke Playford said the northern section includes the heritage listed Blyth Homestead and Sandy Creek Falls, a popular attraction at Litchfield National Park where visitors can swim and camp.

“The southern section of the 4WD track remains closed due to wet sections still persisting on the floodplains,” Mr Playford said.

“Access to Litchfield National Park is accessible via Batchelor, 100km south-west of Darwin with sealed roads and is generally accessible all year, with the unsealed dirt road via the Cox peninsula Road also recently opened this Dry season.”

“The Litchfield Park road gravel section to Cox Peninsula Road is open, but drive with caution as there are currently road works in operation.”

“There is no longer any water in any of the causeways on the Litchfield Park Road and there are three water crossings on the Reynolds 4x4 track and the deepest of these is 0.6m.”

Litchfield National Park offers many camping grounds located throughout the park, as well as picnic areas and bushwalking tracks with other popular swimming spots including Florence Falls and Buley Rockhole also open for swimming.

There is no swimming in the Reynolds River area.
