Monkey Mornings at the Territory Wildlife Park

Come and join the Amazing Drumming Monkeys for their Funky Monkey Mornings at the Territory Wildlife Park these school holidays.

The dynamic entertainers were very popular with families when they performed at the park throughout last years school holiday's, and they have been booked again to perform a 30 minute daily show at 10.45am from 23 June to 13 July 2008.

Manager for the Territory Wildlife Park, Brett Easton said the two monkeys, Bongo and Congo, play African and Latino style hand drums and percussion, sing inspirational songs and perform magic tricks.

"While the show is aimed at children it's great entertainment for all ages," said Mr Easton.

"The show has a positive message for kids about the environment, great drumming for the adults, and variety segments that the whole family will enjoy.

"Families can plan a great day out at the park and learn with our experienced guides and zookeepers."

During the performance one of the zoo keepers will interact with the monkeys and the audience to present 'Creature Feature'.

"Our Creature Feature presentations provide a great opportunity for children to learn about different Top End animals and get to see them up close and personal," Mr Easton said.

The Territory Wildlife Park will continue to hold their daily presentations with Tucker Time at the Billabong at 9.00am followed by the Birds of Prey display at 10.00am.

Creature Feature will be in the Main Station at 11.30am with the Birds of Prey on again at 3pm each day.

The cost of the Amazing Drumming Monkeys show is only \$2 per child, on top of the normal park entry fees with one adult per child receiving free entry to the show.

Usual entry fees apply and Territorian passes are welcome.
