Popular Camping Site Re-opens at Litchfield National Park

The Department of Natural Resources, Environment and The Arts advises that the Litchfield National Park's Walker Creek camping sites, day use area and access road are now open for visitors.

Chief District Ranger John McCartney said the walking track at Walker Creek features eight campsites for visitors and each site has a wood BBQ and picnic table.

"All the camping sites are located on the creek, which is an excellent spot for swimming," Mr McCartney said.

"Walker Creek also features a self-registration board in the car park on which visitors can record which campsite they're staying at and on what dates."

The nearby Bamboo Creek Tin Mine access track has also re-opened for visitors.

"Bamboo Creek is a historical Tin Mine with a loop walk that takes visitors through the remaining infrastructure," Mr McCartney said.

"The loop walk features interpretive signage along the way, to provide information about the historic site.

"Camping is also available at Wangi Falls, Buley Rockhole and Florence Falls, with 4WD camping areas at Tjaynera Falls (Sandy Creek)."
