NORTHERN TERRITORY LICENSING COMMISSION CERTIFICATE OF SPECIAL EXEMPTION SECTION 45EA OF THE SUMMARY OFFENCES ACT

I, RICHARD O'SULLIVAN, Chairman of the Northern Territory Licensing Commission, pursuant to section 45EA of the *Summary Offences Act*, hereby exempt the area as described below from the provisions of section 45D of the *Summary Offences Act*, which prohibits the consumption of liquor in a public place or on unoccupied private land within 2 kilometres of a licensed premises, subject to the conditions described below.

Description

All that parcel of land contained in Portion 587 and identified on the attached plan of DWS Surveys Pty Ltd dated and signed on 20 September 2005.

Conditions

- Where drinkers are banned from the Pub or Club, they are automatically banned from the Pub, Club and Paddock.
- No private vehicles at all allowed in the Paddock.
- No glass containers allowed in the Paddock.
- Time Limit on Opening Paddock - noon to midnight daily.
- The drinking paddock shall be closed whenever under special circumstances the Pub is closed during what would have been normal trading hours.
- The Council can close the Paddock at any time as it sees fit by placing signs at the Pub, Club and Council Office.
- No person under the age of 18 years is allowed in the Paddock.
- Only mid strength and light beer in cans to be drunk in the drinking paddock. All other types of alcohol are not allowed to be drunk in the drinking paddock. Alcohol can be bought from the Daly River Wayside Inn and other licensed premises.
- If there is fighting or the paddock is unsafe for any other reason the Police have the power to close the paddock.
- If children do not attend school the parents are not allowed at the Pub or the paddock. Basically, No School, No Pub, No Paddock.

- Naiyu Nambiyu Council has the ability to ban any person from the Pub or the Paddock. If needed, people can be banned from both the pub and the paddock.
- A current list of banned people will be displayed in the Pub, Naiyu Store, the Council Offices and the Police Station. The Health Centre and Night Patrol will be provided with an updated list of people banned from the Drinking Paddock and or the Pub.
- The Police and the Community Council in consultation with each other, may change the rules of the Drinking Paddock for reasons of immediate safety, and must notify the Licensing Commission within 7 days of the changes.

Period

From 30 January 2008 on any day.
