

**Plant Diseases Control Act**DECLARATION OF QUARANTINE AREA  
MAHOGANY BACTERIAL LEAF SPOT

I, CHRISTOPHER BRUCE BURNS, Minister for Justice and Attorney-General, acting for the Minister for Primary Industry, Fisheries and Resources:

- (a) under section 11(1)(a) of the *Plant Diseases Control Act*: declare the land comprising Section 1602 Hundred of Colton from plan LTO98/102 to be a quarantine area (*the quarantine area*) in respect of the disease Bacterial leaf spot (*Xanthomonas axonopodis* pv. *khayae* (Sabet 1959) Vauterin, Hoste, Kersters & Swings 1995) (*the disease*); and
- (b) under section 11(1)(b)(i) of the *Plant Diseases Control Act* and with reference to section 42 of the *Interpretation Act*, prohibit the removal from the quarantine area of all or part of any plant of the species *Khaya senegalensis* (Desr.) A. Juss. and *Khaya grandifoliola* C. DC. (a *mahogany plant*) without the written permission of the Chief Inspector; and
- (c) under section 11(1)(d) of the *Plant Diseases Control Act*, require the owner of land within the quarantine area to take the measures specified in the Schedule for the control or eradication of the disease.

## SCHEDULE 1

1. Obtain the written permission of the Chief Inspector to remove nursery waste material from the quarantine area.
2. In relation to the removal from the quarantine area of a plant that is not a mahogany plant:
  - (a) obtain the written permission of the Chief Inspector to remove the plant; and
  - (b) before removing the plant - treat it with a prophylactic treatment approved in writing by the Chief Inspector.
3. Take any other measures specified in writing by the Chief Inspector for preventing the spread of the disease within or outside the quarantine area.
