Australian Hotels Association & Liquor, Hospitality and Miscellaneous Workers Union (NT)	To extend the Drug Facilitated Sexual Assault protocol across the NT and for education resources for managers and staff.	\$36,125
Tennant Creek Town Council	A project to install lighting in three areas of the township, a recommendation of the Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) audits in Tennant Creek.	\$23,764
Real Justice NT	Ongoing project to enable restorative justice practices in Palmerston, Tennant Creek and Alice Springs high schools and support the ongoing involvement of Sanderson High School.	\$19,535
