L4 - How to obtain a class “LR” Driver Licence

Effective Date: 13 February 2009

“LR” (Light Rigid) – Definition for Licensing Purposes

A motor vehicle that has a gross vehicle mass (GVM) greater than 4.5 tonnes, but not greater than 8 tonnes or is constructed or equipped to seat more than 12 adults (including the driver).

Class “LR” does not permit you to carry passengers for hire or reward unless you also have a (h) (Hire or Reward) endorsement.

Points to Note

- Before you can be issued with a class “LR” (light rigid) licence, you will need to have held a class “C”(car) licence for at least twelve months continuously and hold an open (not Provisional) driver licence.
- You are not required to undertake a theory test.
- If you have been licensed for twelve months and hold an open (not Provisional) driver licence, you may begin learning to drive a light rigid vehicle, but must be accompanied by a driver who holds a current class “LR” (or higher) licence.
- On the practical test drive, there is no requirement for you to provide a “licensed driver” as the testing officer fulfils this role. You need to be aware however, that you are not licensed to drive unaccompanied to, and possibly from the test location (depending on your test outcome).
- Because you are not a first time driver and have previously held “L” plates, you must instead display a “Driver Under Instruction” sign at the rear of the vehicle. The sign must be yellow and no smaller than 530mm wide and 300mm high with black lettering at least 75mm high.
- Driving methods should be in accordance with the System of Vehicle Control that is detailed in the Learner Driver’s Guide. This guide is incorporated within the NT Road User Handbook and is available for purchase from MVR offices and Police Outstations. It is also available free of charge online at www.mvr.nt.gov.au. The testing process currently in use is designed to assess drivers’ ability to using a systematic approach in maintaining safe and legal driving standards.

Conduct of Practical Test

Tests conducted to this standard will include 4 compulsory manoeuvres:

1. a hill start,
2. reverse parallel park,
3. a reversing exercise, and
4. a U turn.

The remainder of the test will be conducted whilst driving on normal roads and streets. The test is scored according to set observations made by the testing officer. The pass mark is 85%.

Practical tests are conducted at most MVR offices and Police Outstations in remote areas. Tests should be booked in advance, with the test fee being payable at the time of booking. Failure to attend for a scheduled test, without reasonable notice, may result in forfeiture of the test fee.

Failed tests may be re-booked at any time on payment of a new test fee

Bookings for practical tests may be made at any MVR Office either in person, or by phone if you have a current credit card. Police station bookings should be made by arrangement with the local Police officers.

The vehicle which you supply for the test must be registered, roadworthy and clean, and must fall within the "LR" (light rigid) licence category. The vehicle must display a "Driver Under Instruction" sign on the rear.

When you attend for the practical test you must bring your current driver licence and test fee receipt. Failure to do so may result in cancellation of the test and forfeiture of the test fee.

When you pass the practical test, upon payment of the prescribed fee, you will be issued with a new licence.

You should carry your driver licence with you at all times whilst driving.

Important Note:

Your licence will now display the highest class of vehicle that you are licensed to drive. The holder of a licence of a class "LR" licence may, in addition to driving motor vehicles in that class, drive vehicles in any lower class, i.e. "C".

In the event that your driver licence card is lost/misplaced and the card is returned to MVR (e.g. by someone from the place where you have left your card behind, Police, etc), the card will be destroyed. You will need to reapply and pay the prescribed fee for a replacement card.

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
