L23 – NT Driver Licence Conditions Explained

Effective Date: 01 July 2008

Under certain circumstances, the Registrar of Motor Vehicles may attach conditions to your Northern Territory driver licence. The code for each condition will be printed on the photograph side of your licence with a brief interpretation printed on the reverse side. Conditions may be applied for a variety of reasons as outlined below.

Licence Condition Code Table – The following code(s) will be displayed on the front of your Northern Territory driver licence

Code	Meaning	Description	When it is applied
A	Automatic Vehicles only	The licence holder may only drive a motor vehicle fitted with an automatic transmission	On the issue of a provisional licence, or transfer of an overseas licence when the practical driving test or assessment has been conducted using a vehicle fitted with an automatic transmission
B	Synchromesh Transmission	The licence holder may only drive a heavy vehicle if fitted with a synchromesh or automatic transmission.	When a driving test or assessment is conducted using a vehicle with a GVM greater than 8 tonnes and has a synchromesh or automatic transmission.
r	LAMS Learner Approved Motorcycle restriction	The licence holder is restricted to riding Learner Approved Motorcycles that have a power to weight ratio not exceeding 150 kilowatts per tonne and an engine capacity not exceeding 660ml	Applied to a motorcycle Learner Licence and riders in their first 12 months after progressing from a motorcycle Learner Licence.
S	Spectacles or lenses required	The licence holder must wear corrective lenses at all times while driving.	Applied when a person requires corrective lenses to satisfy the vision requirements for fitness to drive standards
V	Modified vehicle required	The licence holder may only drive a motor vehicle fitted with specified driver aids, or modifications as directed in writing by Motor Vehicle Registry.	Applied to a licence when the licence holder is restricted to driving a specifically modified vehicle. See over for full listing of 'V' Restrictions
X	Specific Licence conditions apply	The driver licence and/or written instrument must be carried at all times when driving/riding a motor vehicle.	To be placed on all licences issued with specific licence conditions not covered elsewhere within this table. See over for full listing of 'X' Restrictions
Z	Zero % BAC	Must observe a Zero Blood Alcohol Concentration restriction.	Applied when the licence holder is less than 25 years old or has not been licensed for a period greater than 3 years.

Licence Sub-Condition Code Table – These descriptors are used when Condition code “X” or “V” is applied to your driver licence. The ‘Meaning’ for each Code in this table will print on the reverse side of your Northern Territory driver licence.

Code	Meaning	Description	When it is applied
VA	Steering spinner knob – left	The licence holder may only drive vehicles fitted with a left hand spinner knob.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
VB	Steering spinner knob – right	The licence holder may only drive vehicles fitted with a right hand spinner knob.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
VC	Power steering only	The licence holder may only drive vehicles fitted with power steering.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
VD	Automatic vehicle only	The licence holder may only drive vehicles fitted with an automatic transmission.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
VE	Modified indicator arm – left	The licence holder may only drive vehicles fitted with an extended indicator arm – left.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
VF	Modified indicator arm – right	The licence holder may only drive vehicles fitted with an extended indicator arm – right.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
VG	Head operated indicators	The licence holder may only drive a vehicle fitted with indicators operated by head movements.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
VH	Accelerator left of brake	The licence holder may only drive a vehicle with an accelerator fitted to the left of the brake pedal.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
VI	Hand operated foot controls	The licence holder can only drive a vehicle fitted with hand operated controls for brakes and accelerator.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
VJ	External mirrors left & right	The licence holder may only drive vehicle fitted with external mirrors to the left and right hand side of the vehicle.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
VK	Wide angle interior mirror	The licence holder may only drive vehicle fitted with a wide-angle interior rear view mirror.	Applied when recommended by a health professional
XA	Annual medical review required	The driver licence is issued subject to an annual medical review.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
XB	Annual criminal history check	The driver licence is issued subject to an annual criminal history check.	Applied when recommended for an (h) or (d) Endorsement.
XC	For training & assessment only	The driver licence is issued for training and assessment purposes only.	Issued to a licence holder who requires a practical test or rehabilitation assessment before driver licence renewal or re-licensing after a medical suspension.
XD	Not between sunset & sunrise	Licence holder is not to drive between sunset and sunrise.	Applied when recommended by a health professional.
XE	Endorsement area restricted	The driver licence endorsement is valid in a specific area only.	Applied when an “h” or “d” endorsement is restricted to a specific place, community or area.
XF	Licence class area restricted	The driver licence class is valid in a specific area only.	Applied when an early upgrade to a heavy vehicle licence is approved.
XG	In company of Rehabilitation Service	The driver licence holder may only drive when accompanied by an instructor experienced in rehabilitation training.	Applied when a person is suffering from a medical condition and requires training prior to re-applying for a driver licence.

Code	Meaning	Description	When it is applied
XH	In company of full licence holder	The licence holder may only drive when accompanied by a person holding a full licence (not Provisional) for the class of vehicle being driven.	Usually issued to a person who has failed an unreasonable number of driving tests or is considered to represent a risk to other road users when qualifying for an overseas licence transfer.
XI	Not to exceed 80 km/h	The licence holder must not drive at a speed greater than 80 km/h.	Usually issued to a person who has failed an unreasonable number of driving tests or is considered to represent a risk to other road users when qualifying for an overseas licence transfer.
XJ	Zero % BAC	The licence holder must observe Zero Blood Alcohol Concentration.	Usually issued to a person who has failed an unreasonable number of driving tests or is considered to represent a risk to other road users when qualifying for an overseas licence transfer.
XL	Practical test within 3 months of issue	The licence holder must undertake a practical assessment within 3 months of issue.	Occasionally issued to a person who has failed an unreasonable number of driving tests or is considered to represent a risk to other road users when his/her overseas licence is transferred.
XM	Not exceed 100 km/h motorcycle	The licence holder must not exceed 100 km/h while riding a motorcycle.	Applied to a class "R" licence when recommended.
XN	No pillion any motorcycle	The licence holder must not carry pillion passenger while riding a motorcycle.	Applied to a class "R" licence when recommended.
XP	Must wear approved helmet	The licence holder must wear an approved motorcycle rider's helmet.	Applied to a licence when the vehicle being driven/ridden requires registration with special conditions such as Quad bikes or Trikes etc.
XQ	Refer to Driver's Instrument	The licence holder must observe conditions listed on instrument	Applied to a licence when the holder is subject to conditions other than those listed.
XR	Lenses when driving > 8 tonnes	The licence holder must wear corrective lenses at all times while driving a vehicle greater than 8 tonnes.	Applied when a person requires corrective lenses to satisfy the vision requirements for fitness to drive (commercial vehicle driver) standards
XU	Automatic Only Heavy Vehicle (MR and above)	The licence holder may only drive a heavy vehicle fitted with an automatic transmission.	On the issue of a licence when the practical driving test or assessment has been conducted using a vehicle fitted with an automatic transmission. Can only be removed by retaking the practical driving test in a vehicle fitted with another transmission type.

The Registrar of Motor Vehicles is required to collect information for registrations, licences and permits under section 92 of the Motor Vehicles Act.
